The Ruth Mortimer Rare Book Room of the Neilson Library at Smith College in Northampton, MA, has contributed ten manuscripts and associated images to our database, including four Books of Hours (MSS 254, 255, 274 and 288) and a Franciscan Breviary with a colophon dated 1522 (MS 261).

The Mortimer Rare Book Room is a participant in the Mellon-funded project to create digital facsimiles for all of the medieval manuscripts held by the libraries and museums of the Five Colleges Consortium of western Massachusetts.
